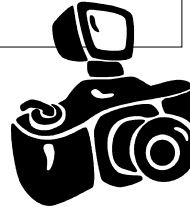

COMOX PHOTO FEST 2007



The Comox Business in Action (BIA) is pleased to announce the second annual “Comox Photo Fest”, scheduled for August 11th and 12th this year. We plan on building on the success of last year and attract professional and amateur photographers from across the country to showcase their works.
